April 2, 2023 Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

What's your car? Let's say it's a fancy silver Toyota. Now imagine you're having lunch in a restaurant and suddenly see two men outside attempting to steal it. You run outside and confront them. They respond, "The master has need of it." How do you respond? Would you just let them take it, and leave you without a car? I don't think I would.

Yet that is precisely what the owners of the colt on Palm Sunday do. Stunningly, and perhaps a little comically, Jesus instructs two of his disciples to commandeer a colt for him to ride. And when they hear the disciples say, **"The master has need of it**," they let them take it. Of course, Jesus *knew* they'd let it go. He gave them the grace to let go of what is rightfully theirs. The result? That colt became perhaps the most famous and important animal ever. The beast plays a role in the redemption of the world.

As Holy Week begins, Jesus perhaps will send people to you to ask for something valuable to you. Perhaps it's your car. More likely it's something like your attention, time, or energy. It's natural to resist at first. We've got things to do, after all. But if the interruption is from Jesus himself, listen to that voice which calmly says, **"The master has need of it."** And simply let it go. You'll be amazed what the master will do with it.

Thank you for the donations you have shared with our conference for those in need. Our conference continues to host Bingo with the residents at Sharon Woods HealthCare. Our next **Bingo** session is on April 13, 2023 and we could use some additional prizes for the residents. Would you be able to donate something? Some suggestions:

Bottles of laundry detergent, CD's, shampoo, lotion, body wash, bar soap, bath towels & wash cloths, jewelry, wallets, purses, watches, flashlights, throws/blankets, water bottles, thermal mugs, batteries, socks, slippers. We asked for suggestions recently and residents requested fabric softener sheets and adult coloring books, crayons, markers, and colored pencils. Stores like the Dollar Tree are a great source of these items. We can also share gently used clothing such as coats, fleece pants, pajamas/night gowns, sweatshirts, sweaters, shirts.

We CANNOT bring glass items, food items or hand sanitizer to Bingo. Please bring the items to the Holy Family Church office, 3720 N. Sterling, before April 8, 2023 (for the April 13 game, or any time after that).

Because of changes in the federal program known as SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), many of the friendsin-need who ask for help from our conference have seen a decrease in their benefits (LINK cards), which makes it more difficult for them to buy food and supplies for themselves and their family. We continue to need items for the **pantry** at Holy Family to help these friends-in-need. Items that are always needed include peanut butter, personal and household supplies including hand and body soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, dish detergent, laundry detergent, and toilet paper. We can also use soup, canned fish / canned meat, and canned fruit. Donated items for the pantry can be left in the SVdP box in the church foyer or former Cry Room at church.
